Connect to God's truth by sharing...

- Humans fail. During Jesus' betrayal, trial, and condemnation, everyone seemed to be against Him.
- The Jewish court of law found ways to incriminate Jesus.
- Jesus' friends and followers betrayed, abandoned, and denied Him.
- The people were focused on pleasing the authorities and willingly gave Jesus to be crucified.
- It's quite clear: humans are not perfect.
- Like the Jewish leaders, we could wrongly be protecting what we believe is right.
- Like Judas, we could decide that following Jesus is of less value.
- Like Peter, we could fear for our lives and deny knowing Him.
- We will always fail if not for Jesus, who gives us strength and forms us to be Christlike.
