Connect to God's truth by sharing...

- Guess what . . . Money, too, must be handled with care.
- The Bible teaches both the value of money and its dangers.
- Money is a useful tool and helpful for life. It's also a blessing from God.
- In fact, money is an indicator of character. The Bible shows that God blesses those who are content, good stewards, hard-working, and faithful.
- However, money is a dangerous master. Once we fall in love with money, it can consume us.
- The Bible warns that money will never satisfy us; it will not save us from death; and it tries to take the place of God.
- It's good to have money, but the pursuit and desire for money can become your god.
- When we are in Christ, He gives us the grace to trust Him, be generous, and invest in what's truly valuable.
