Connect to God's truth by sharing...

- Let's discuss three pictures of marriage from Scripture.
- First, we have two becoming one. This is more than physical. It's also emotional, spiritual, intellectual, and financial. Married people need to rediscover their joint identity.
- Next, we become partners with God and each other. The differences of each spouse are designed to complement one another. God has purposes for married couples that are meant to be achieved together. Spouses are not burdens or the enemy; they are partners.
- Lastly, marriage is a sacred covenant made before God. It isn't something people jump into without consideration. More than being under the law, the marriage covenant is sacred to God.
- When marriage happens as it must, it will overflow with love, honor, and fulfillment.

Pick a question and pray together...

Discuss Together (pick one)

 How can this discussion change the way you treat your spouse (if married) or the way you look forward to or consider

marriage (if unmarried)?

If married: Are you cooperating with the process of *becoming one* with your spouse? What might you still be holding on to as remnants of your old identity? (i.e., preferences, hobbies, biological family, career)

Pray Together (pick one)

- If unmarried, pray for deep insight into the mystery of marriage that can shape your perspective. Pray to be open to God's will for you regarding marriage.
- If married, pray that you will continue to deeply understand your new joint identity, your partnership with God and your spouse, and the covenant you made before God.
