### Engage

 Start the conversation with this question...

Have you ever participated in a community or volunteer effort? What was your experience like?

### Key Points

 Connect to God's truth by sharing...

- Because of sin, the world is full of injustice. Left on their own, people cheat, take advantage of others, live for their gain, or ignore those in need.
- But because God is love, His heart is to stand for those who couldn't stand for themselves.
- The Bible tells us that Jesus stood with the poor, oppressed, and vulnerable. He fought for those who couldn't fight for themselves.
- Being socially responsible is part of following and knowing Jesus. Jesus tells us to love our neighbor, pay fair wages, and be generous to the poor.
- As you grow in God and know Him more, you will understand and live out His heart for social responsibility.

## **Discuss Together** (*pick at least one*)

- Do you understand the concept of the vulnerable? Who would you describe as vulnerable in your context?
- In what ways can we practice social responsibility in our daily lives?

## **PROCLAIM**

 Declare this truth based on your identity in Christ

## **Key Truth**

God calls and empowers me to stand with those who cannot stand on their own.

## **Pray Together** (*pick at least one*)

- Pray to deeply understand and embrace God's heart for social responsibility.
- Ask God to help you live in a way that displays His love and justice. Ask Him for a specific person or organization you can help this week.
- Pray for each other's prayer requests.
