 Start the conversation with this question...

What's a place or activity that helps you feel at peace and refreshed?

### Key Points

 Connect to God's truth by sharing...

- Part of worship is enjoying and resting in the presence of God!
- Praying is like breathing. We can enjoy and rest in God's presence by spending time with Him in prayer.
- Through the Holy Spirit, we are no longer separated from God—His presence is always with us.
- What we desire most is what we ultimately worship. When we desire God above all, we delight in His presence and worship Him.
- We can abide in God's presence in practical ways:
  - Be still before Him in prayer (Psalm 37:7).
  - Meditate on His Word and proclaim His goodness.
  - Fellowship with others—God is with us when we gather in His name (Matthew 18:20).

## **Discuss Together** (*pick at least one*)

- What are some ways you personally connect with God and enjoy His presence?
- Do you sometimes still feel far from God? Why do you think so?
- What distractions or struggles might be keeping you from resting in God's presence? How can you overcome them?

### **Key Truth**

I worship God by staying close to Him as I pray, meditate, proclaim, and fellowship with others.

## **Pray Together** (*pick at least one*)

- Thank God for the privilege and joy of being in His presence!
- Pray for a heart of worship that finds rest in God's presence and desires Him above all else.
- Pray for each other's prayer requests.
