Start the conversation with this question...

Can you think of a time when you realized God was at work in a simple, or ordinary moment?

Key Points

Connect to God's truth by sharing...

- As the Church on mission, Jesus invites us to see the world the way He does and move forward with faith alongside Him.
- **See the opportunity.** Jesus saw God at work in everyday moments. Ordinary conversations and daily routines can be open doors for the gospel when we're attentive.
- **See the urgency.** While others wanted to wait, Jesus said the time was now. God's mission isn't something to delay—people are ready to hear, right where we are.
- **See our need for one another.** God designed the mission to be lived out in fellowship. Some sow and some reap, encouraging one another and rejoicing in what God is doing as one family.
- When we see as Jesus sees, we can live on mission with faith, urgency, and unity.

Discuss Together *(pick at least one)*

- What might an “everyday opportunity” to love or share Jesus look like in your life right now?
- Why do you think it’s easy to delay, miss, or overlook God’s mission in daily life?
- Have you ever helped plant a seed—even if you didn’t get to see the outcome? What was that like?
- How can we encourage and support one another as we live on mission together?
